WALKING WITH JESUS

Luke 24 verse 32 has one of my very favourite lines in the Gospels. The couple were walking away from Jerusalem to Emmaus and were utterly dejected because of Jesus' death on the Cross. They had heard rumours of Jesus' Resurrection but this seemed impossible so they were returning home. Late in the day, on the road, they met a man who walked with them, listened to them and talked with them. They were so intrigued that they invited him to supper. It was only when he broke bread that they recognised him as the Risen Jesus. Immediately he left them and they ran back all the way to Jerusalem to tell the 11 disciples who were still in that Upper Room—they had met the Risen Jesus!

The words of the song opposite by Jess Ray, a singer/songwriter from North Carolina, pick up on that experience of meeting Jesus as a young woman and the amazing feeling of his presence, his truth and his love. Jess speaks of a fire which began that can't be put out.

If we want to kindle that fire then we should best spend time in Jesus presence—for he will walk with us, listen to us and teach us.



As the Coronavirus continues to spread globally, over 850,000 Rohingya refugees living in overcrowded camps in Cox's Bazar are at serious risk.

Across the world Christian Aid is working with local partners, including faith leaders, to reach the most vulnerable communities with urgent health messages to keep people safe, drawing on experience in combating the Ebola crisis. Help is given to inform people about the dangers, providing hygiene and hand washing and ensuring that health facilities in camps have spaces for people who have contracted the virus. But more is needed.

The people in the poorest countries will be hit harder than us by this virus—those living in poverty already face a lack of water, food and medical care. The spread of this virus will be devastating.

We can support our global neighbours

- £27 could help provide food to someone in quarantine, so they don't have to leave their home and risk spreading the virus
- £50 could help pay for a community toilet and handwashing block
- £120 could help provide areas within health facilities to isolate anyone with symptoms
