an Easter Story

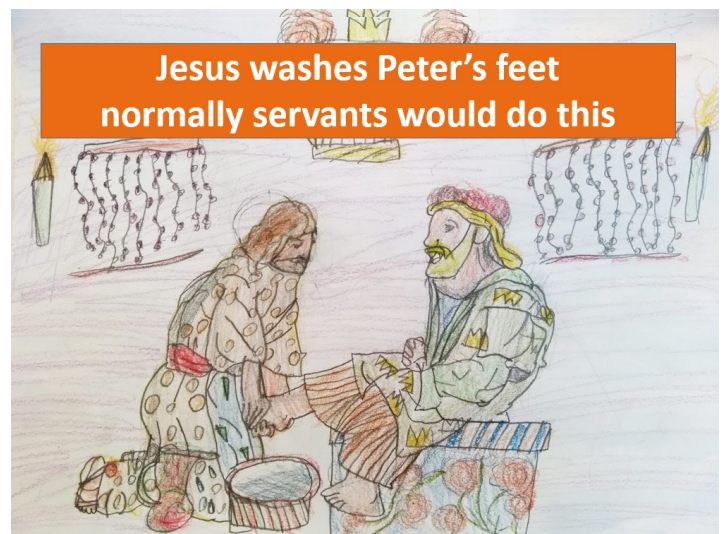
'Can you make an Easter Story video for our Abbeyhill children to watch at home?'

Here we see 2 emergency workers in Jerusalem on a break from constant calls with the Covid-19 crisis. One is a Jew, the other a Muslim. Standing alongside their ambulance vehicle and praying in their respective traditions. Avraham Mint, a religious Jew stands facing Jerusalem while Zoher Abu Jama, a Muslim kneels on a prayer rug facing Makkah.

"The fact that it is so simple makes it so powerful. I believe that Zoher and I and most of the world understand that we have to raise our heads and pray. That's all that's left."

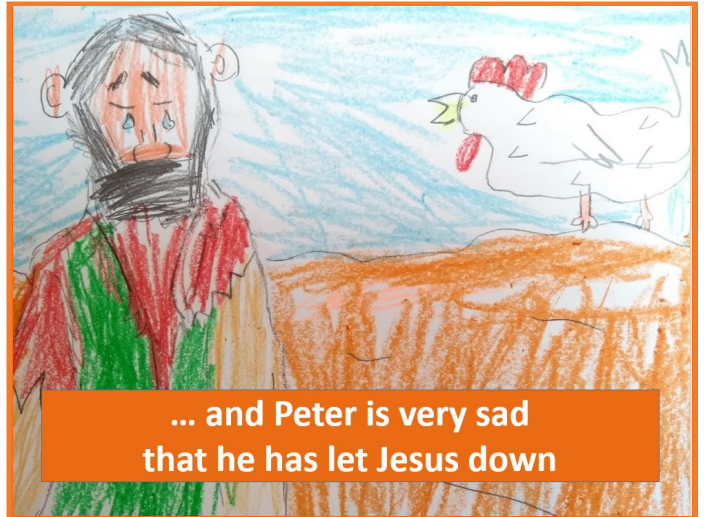

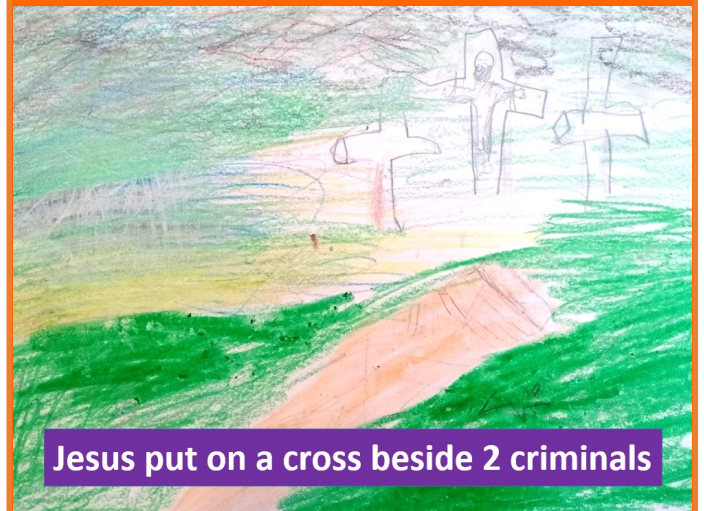
Our confidence is in the Lord

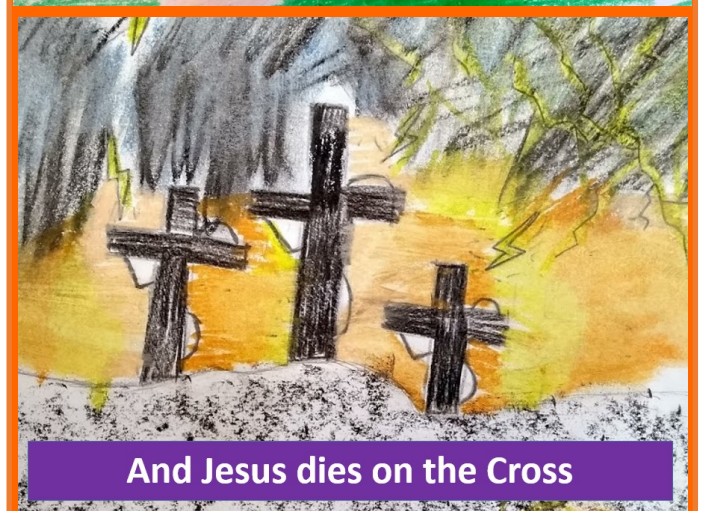
