



Assembly Council

The Assembly Council of the Church of Scotland is only one year old. With only 12 Trustees, it was formed at the 2019 General Assembly with the task of implementing a 'radical action plan' to shape the church and its mission for the future.

"It was a big task – a comprehensive review of the way the church arranges priorities with a focus on mission and how we can best engage with the under-40 age group"

"We have to be brave enough to grasp nettles which had been left alone."

With the cancellation of the 2020 General Assembly, the Assembly Council organised a webinar which brought 1000 people together last Friday to share some ideas which seem even more important given the current crisis including

 We need fewer Presbyteries which have better resources to help local congregations.

This month the 3 Presbyteries of St Andrew's,
Kirkcaldy and Dunfermline led the way
by forming the new Presbytery of Fife
and Aberdeen & Shetland
have formed the one new Presbytery

 In order to be able to afford new initiatives in Mission to engage with people who won't be interested in traditional church we will need to let some things go.

"Jesus talked about pruning the vine removing the dead and duplicate branches"

 We still have too many buildings which are hugely expensive to maintain and bring up to acceptable standards. Presbyteries need to be able to help people make difficult decisions about buildings.

"For some people the buildings seem to be more important than what we do in them!"
