

SUCCESSES

Chosen as one of Jesus' apostles
Matt. 10:2

Walks to Jesus on the water Matt. 14:29

Confesses that Jesus is the Messiah, which is the foundation of the church Matt. 16:15–19

Witnesses the transfiguration Matt. 17:1–8

Vows never to fall away and to die with Jesus if necessary Matt. 26:33,35

Shares intimate moment with Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane Matt. 26:36–38

Follows Jesus after his arrest while the other disciples flee Matt. 26:58

Witnesses the risen Lord separately Luke 24:34; 1 Cor. 15:5

Reinstated by Jesus after his denial John 21:15–19

Gives the first sermon and 3,000 people believe Acts 2:14-41

Heals and raises the dead Acts 3:1-10; 5:12-16; 9:34,39-40

Proclaims Christ even after being imprisoned for preaching Acts 4:1-11,19-20

Assists Samaritans in receiving the Holy Spirit Acts 8:14–17

Preaches to Gentiles, and they receive the Holy Spirit Acts 10:27-28,34-35,44

Acknowledges that both Jews and Gentiles are saved by grace Acts 15:5-11

Writes two epistles: 1 and 2 Peter

FAILURES

Loses faith while walking on the water and almost drowns Matt. 14:30

Rebukes Jesus when he predicts his death Matt. 16:21–23

Initially refuses to let Jesus wash his feet John 13:8

Falls asleep in the Garden of Gethsemane Matt. 26:40-41

Tries to protect Jesus and cuts off Malchus's ear Luke 22:50-51: John 18:10

Denies Jesus three times Matt. 26:69–75

Doesn't immediately believe when he sees the empty tomb Luke 24:11–12: John 20:6–7,9

Questions the vision of the unclean animals despite clear instructions from the Lord Acts 10:13-14



In each of these situations think of what quality is Peter showing—is it fear or faith, pride or humility, denial or acceptance? How do these play out in your life?
