#### Friends ... some good news!

We are now being given an indication by the Scottish Government as to when churches might be able to open again provided there is a low or decreasing infection rate and other critical conditions are met.

**Thursday 18th June** will see **Phase 2** in the easing of restrictions allowing for churches to be open for private prayer, and for marriages to take place, with a limited number of attendees, all subject to physical distancing and hygiene safeguards.

**Thursday 9th July** is the date when **Phase 3** of easing restrictions is expected to be announced when places of worship will be allowed to open for extended groups, again, subject, again, to physical distancing and hygiene safeguards.

It is absolutely clear, too, that no building can legally open without a legally mandated COVID risk assessment, the paperwork for which is being prepared. The Church of Scotland has a management group meeting on a weekly basis to monitor and advise on developments.

Together, we pray that progress can be made in bringing about an end to the present situation of danger to health of mind and body


Romans 8 verses 38-39

### God's ways!

While we may look at what is happening in the US with racial injustice and despair, we, ourselves, need to reinforce the value of every life in our own hearts, minds, communities and nation.

In 2013 three young, black, American women started **#blacklivesmatter** because they were outraged at the way their brothers had been treated by the justice system. A reaction to the movement was when other people started using the phrase **'all lives matter'** to try to correct the idea that black lives are maybe more important. But **#blacklivesmatter** supporters stress that the movement isn't about believing no other races matter. Instead, the movement seeks to highlight and change how racism disproportionately affects the black community, in terms of police brutality, job security, socioeconomic status, educational opportunities, and more.

Bishop Desmond Tutu is often quoted as saying 'If you are neutral in situations of injustice, you have chosen the side of the oppressor.'
