Hear our prayer.

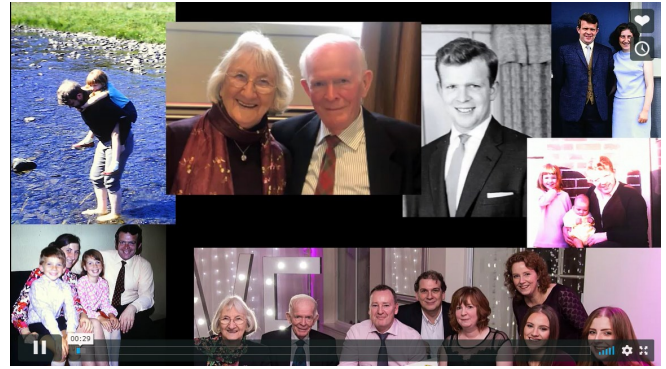
Living God, who wills to be merciful to all,

calling for united prayer.



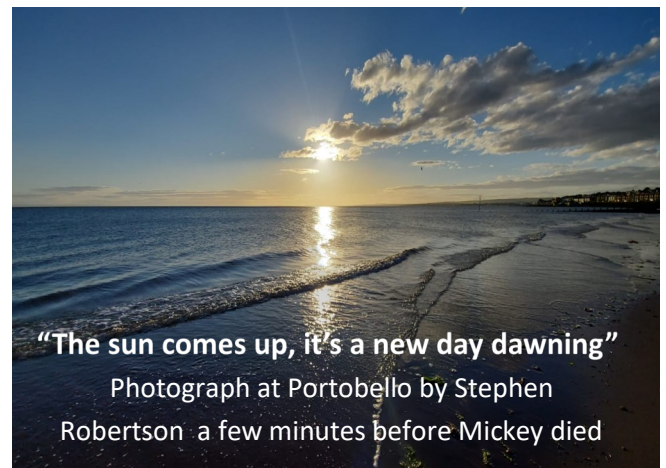
