Hand crafting through Lent

You are invited to contribute to displays at the local churches during Holy Week.

You will need: Inspiration and skill to make hand crafted hearts. Hearts for our noticeboard and for giving out to people can be from wool but hearts for outdoors must be weatherproof so using materials such as wood, felt, wire, or yarn.

How to take part: We are inviting as many people as possible to craft hand-made hearts. Hearts can be any colour and in wool or any weatherproof material. Heart shapes should not exceed 10cm in height, but they can be as small as a pound coin. They must have a hole or hanging loop incorporated into the design to enable them to be hung. If you don't have a computer to view

here is a crochet pattern for a teeny tiny heart

:: Round 1 ::

ch 2, then work 8dc into ring. sl st into 2nd ch of initial ch-2 to close round (9 stitches)

:: Round 2 ::

5tr's into 1st stitch
1tr into 2nd stitch
1htr into 3rd stitch
1dc into 4th stitch
1tr, ch 2, sl st into 2nd ch from hook
(picot point made),
1tr (all worked into 5th stitch)
1dc into 6th sticth
1htr into 7th stitch
1tr into 8th stitch

Fasten off as described above, pulling tail end firmly through to the back

5tr's into 9th st.
