

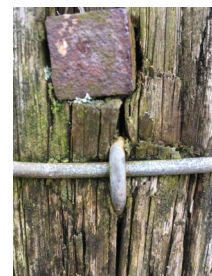
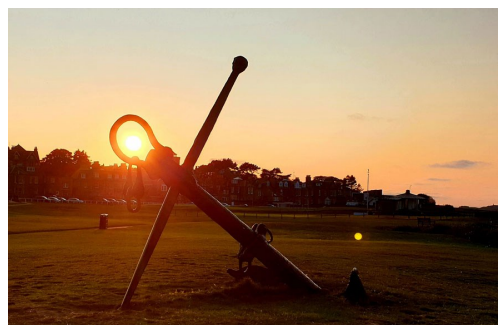

- no other happiness matches this.

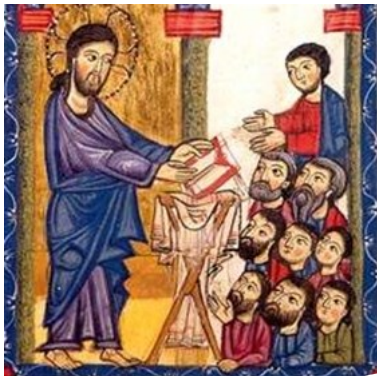
Make time to love
