War and conflict forcibly displaces 79.5 million people and the climate crisis has meant many more need to move from their homeland because of the disruptions of monsoons, unprecedented drought and sea levels rising causing flooding. While some of the poorest countries have had to provide refuge to neighbours it seems right that the UK should welcome a fair share of those looking for refuge.
