7pm Wednesdays Dinner Church 3rd & 10th November Vigil for COP26


With stories, pictures and prayers we will hold these two Wednesdays as a time of reflection and prayer for the Climate Summit meeting in Glasgow.

The Art of Protest: a Lament in Black Paint







lain Campbell is the artist of Painting Luke's Gospel where we had 24 of his paintings in 2020 in our church. This month he has 3 paintings in the Kelvingrove Art Gallery in Glasgow as part of the **COP26 FRINGE**

3 PORTRAITS DIPPED IN BLACK PAINT!

The idea is that we might be curious about these three people and the way their lives have been changed by the Climate Crisis—the portraits are half-hidden.

Featured in the paintings is Joyce, a mother of two from Malawi, who lost her home during a hurricane in Malawi. She retrained as a tailor; Rita, from Bangladesh, she and her family live in extreme poverty in an area devastated by hurricanes and typhoons. Rita now grows sunflowers to survive, and Dhital, from Nepal, she and her family lost their home and livelihood in the severe flooding. They already have a new home that is both earthquake and flood resistant.

This art project is a joint initiative shared by Christian Aid, Tearfund and Islamic Relief showing how the Aid Agencies work together to help the poorest people. At COP26 they also want to give a strong voice to governments who must take more responsibility for reducing carbon levels which effect the world climate.
